Vivat to Don Duncan for his spectacular display of grace upon the fencing field!


We look forward to having you as our champion for the next year.


East Kingdom Gate Guard - July 31<sup>st</sup> 10:00 a.m.-12:00 p.m.

Lady Aibhilin inghean ui Phaidin*

This quarter, our Barony had the pleasure of being part of Mt. Holly's Pillage the Village for the 2<sup>nd</sup> year. This year our demo was center stage for the day. We had a large set up with a Chatelaine's tent with a display of A&S items, tent displaying equipment for martial activities, Lady Caitriona's tent with her calligraphy and illumination, and a tent for make and take youth activities. We started the day with a fashion show of a variety of medieval garb. The day continued with the Baronial Rapier Championship tournament, led by outgoing Champion Lord Melchior, and was won by Don Duncan Kieran. A demonstration of heaving fighting followed. The wonderful day finished off with Don Duncan leading a demonstration of medieval dance with baronial and audience participation. Our Chatelaine and her Deputy had a guest book in which we had several interested people put down their information. In addition to some new people who were very interested in the SCA, we had some former members who came out to reunite.

Baroness Drueta and Lady Genevra organized a wonderful demonstration to show visitors of Pillage the Village the many aspects of the SCA. Being part of this demo and having many newcomers approach as I ran youth activities or walked around, I really began to realize that we “individual members” are often the first person with whom newcomers have contact. Although our Chatelaine is there to support us and perhaps follow through for us, being comfortable talking to and welcoming a new person when you are their first point of contact is a very important first step.

Elise Fleming (Alys Katharine) wrote an article entitled NEWCOMERS ARE NICE... Once You Get to Know Them: Advice to Established Members that can be found of the Society Chatelaine's website (<http://www.sca.org/officers/chatelain/pdf/NewcomersAreNice.pdf>).

She explains 7 important points to remember so that you may feel comfortable to talking with a newcomer and so that the newcomer feels welcomed rather than overwhelmed:

- First, go up and say hello. The “newcomer” may be a former participant so, “If you are not that “old” in the group, ask if the person is new.”
- Introduce the new person to your friends and to those working on crafts.
- Ask what the newcomer knows about the SCA. You can also ask them what brought them to the SCA and about their modern day interests and activities to get a better idea of what they might like to learn more about.
- Ask the person if you can explain what is going on (instead of telling them “if you have any questions just ask”). The newcomer may not know what to ask nor may not feel comfortable asking. The author suggests starters such as:
  - May I explain...?”
  - “Are you interested in...?”
  - “What do you like to do?”
  - “What are your interests/hobbies?” “Would you like to talk to someone about...? (leatherworking, cooking, embroidery, fighting, armor, calligraphy, archery, costuming, music, brewing, etc.) ?”
  - “What can I explain?”
  - “May I introduce you to someone who knows about...?”
- Help the newcomer participate.
- See that newcomer information is available.
- Get the newcomer’s name and contact information.

She suggests to “remember that a newcomer may suffer from overload.” There may come a point when you want to go back to your business, “suggest that they might like to look around and then come back to talk with you before they leave.” If the Chatelaine is available you can then introduce to the newcomer so that the Chatelaine can supplement or follow up with the newcomer.

For a newcomer being noticed and recognized and seeing that you’re pleased to see them (“but not gushy”) may be the first step to them becoming a new member of the SCA. And remember, we were all newcomers once.
